



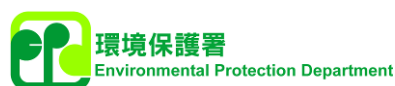
“Friends of EcoPark” Award Presentation Ceremony 2011/12
Paving the way for a greener future with converging effort

[Hong Kong, 18 May, 2012] Operating since 2007, EcoPark is one of the Hong Kong Special Administration Region Government’s (the “Government”) major investments in supporting local recycling industry. Backed by a capital investment of HK\$319 million, EcoPark provides long-term land at affordable costs and a whole package of amenities to recyclers with a view to alleviating their capital investment for infrastructure, thereby encouraging their investment in advanced and value-added technologies as well as jumpstarting a circular economy.

To encourage collaborations between the local recycling businesses and private/ public sectors and to raise public awareness of the potential role of the local recycling industry in waste management, Environmental Protection Department (EPD) and EcoPark Management Company have jointly launched the “Friends of EcoPark” Scheme (the “Scheme”) since 2010. The Scheme is open to any private companies and public organizations that demonstrate an incumbent partnership with the tenants in EcoPark. The ideal participants must have shown supports to the EcoPark’s tenants in form of waste source supplies; co-ordination of waste collection; or regular use of recycled products produced by the EcoPark tenants. Through an annual Award Presentation Ceremony, the Scheme recognizes these private companies and public organizations for their contribution to the waste recycling businesses in EcoPark and also helps motivate partnership initiatives between the two.

Riding on the success of last year, “Friends of EcoPark 2011/12” Award Presentation Ceremony, which took place on 17th May 2012 at Business Environment Council, has witnessed heightened interest and support from the private and public sectors. Awardees of the Scheme are from different industries and trades, including manufacturing, catering, hotel and retail industries, property management, logistic companies, public organizations, government departments, etc. This year, the number of companies and organizations bestowed with the certificates increased to 79, an encouraging leap from last year’s 49.

During the Award Presentation Ceremony, selected EcoPark tenants presented the development of their recycling businesses and shared how the Scheme helped to inspire





green initiatives among not only industry players but also the general public.

Li Tong Group, a certified international asset recovery and electronics recycler, showcased its collaboration with EcoPark by providing Hong Kong with professional one-stop electronic waste recycling service. Another tenant, St. James' Settlement, a non-profit-making organization recycler of waste electrical and electronic equipment (WEEE), was granted a 3-year funding in October 2010 from the Environment and Conservation Fund to operate a WEEE Recycling Centre in EcoPark. It shared how the project raised public awareness of the value of reusing and recycling waste materials.

Two awardees, Fujitsu Hong Kong Limited and Siemens Home Appliances, spoke of how the Scheme has helped to forge mutually beneficial relationships between EcoPark's tenants and partners from the private/ public sectors.

Mr. Chan Wang-sang, MH, Tuen Mun District Councilor and Chairman of Environment, Hygiene and District Development Committee, noted in his speech at the Award Presentation Ceremony that Hong Kong's per capita waste generation has surpassed Taiwan and Japan and become the world's highest. Recycling, albeit the most effective way to reduce waste, was challenging in Hong Kong due to the scarcity of recycling materials. In the future, he expected to see closer cooperation between the Tuen Mun district council and EcoPark in co-organizing more eco-activities such as neighborhood recycling events, with a view to attracting more participations and supports from the local community.

EcoPark endeavors to transform the city's long-existing management practices of "bale-and-export" for recyclable materials, namely packing and shipping recyclable materials to overseas for recycling, into a new practice of that waste materials collected are processed locally to produce useful outputs, which can then be put back into the consumption loop. Currently, all six lots in Phase 1 of EcoPark have been leased and five of them have commenced operation since 2010 for recycling of waste cooking oil, waste metals, waste wood, waste computers and waste plastics. Moreover, the two waste recycling centers run by non-profit making organizations (i.e. Yan Oi Tong and St. James' Settlement) that process waste plastics and WEEE, have commenced operation since March and October 2010 respectively.

In addition, another five new tenants are now preparing design and construction planning





for their plants in Phase 2. This group of tenants target to commission their operation in 2013 and will bring in new types of recycling businesses including recycling of waste construction materials, waste glass, and waste rubber tyres.

Thanks to the support of all “Friends of EcoPark” awardees and the wider community, promising progress has been made in the development of EcoPark over the past year. The sustainability of local recycling business in EcoPark, however, hinges on the tenants’ ability to overcome challenges such as vigorous market competition, cost escalation and a scarcity of recyclable materials. In view of these obstacles, EPD and EcoPark Management Company have been stepping up the marketing of the EcoPark, amplifying its tenants’ presence in eco-exhibitions and conferences, and helping to organize the collection of recyclable materials in residential and industrial neighborhoods. Meanwhile, promoting “Friends of EcoPark” to a wider audience is also vital to the sustainable development of EcoPark.

In the near future, the new Phase 2 tenants will commission their recycling businesses in EcoPark, bringing in vibrancy and diversity which are conducive to the long term growth of this fledgling green business. We sincerely invite all the “Friends of EcoPark” awardees to further deliver the supports to all EcoPark tenants to develop their recycling business. With the concerted effort of all eco-friendly members of the community, we are confident that the development of local recycling business can be propelled to the next level.
